SHERIFF'S TASK FORCE ON 21ST CENTURY POLICING

Sheriff Jim Hart created the Sheriff's Task Force on 21st Century Policing to conduct a comprehensive examination of how Sheriff policing services are delivered in Santa Cruz County communities. The Sheriff's Task Force was initiated to foster strong, collaborative relationships between the Sheriff's Office and the communities we protect, maintain trust between citizens and deputies and promote effective crime prevention.

The Sheriff's Task Force consisted of twenty deputies, sergeants, lieutenants and civilian support staff who were assigned to evaluate and implement 79 recommendations and action items applicable to local law enforcement in the Final Report of the President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing. Between January and June, 2016 the Task Force met six times to review, analyze and recommend measures to implement 21st Century Policing concepts and strategies. In July, the Task Force met with Sheriff Hart and Chief Wilson for an open discussion about the direction of local policing and the processes of cultural change. On August 17th, Sheriff Hart will provide a final report to the community on the results of these efforts.

This report reflects the work of the Sheriff's Task Force as well as the work of many others in various roles and assignments at the Sheriff's Office. It is intended to serve as a summary of the Task Force's efforts and a statement of commitment to the community about what the Sheriff's Office stands for.
